


Medium Term Planning

Term - Summer 1 Year Group - 4 Topic - Stone Age to the Iron Age



National Curriculum

As historians we will study the lifestyle and culture of Stone, Bronze and Iron Age people and the history and legacy of the different ages. We will learn about their customs and discover how archaeologists help us learn more about these people.

As artists we will explore the work of the Stone and Iron Age and compare and contrast their styles and techniques with modern ones, commenting on the ideas and purposes. We will carry out Stone Age artwork.

As geographers we will investigate how the geography has changed over time in Britain. We will also look at how climate and environment affected where the Celts live too.

As designers, we will study their structures including homes and landmarks, such as Stonehenge.

Speaking and Listening

We will generate questions about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages from pictures and videos during our P4C sessions.

In small groups we will research and present information about the different ages showing how they were different to our country both in time and place.

We will 'Hot Seat' famous Celtic characters and act out buying a Celtic home too.

We will also talk about our art work and the work of others commenting on their ideas and what they have produced.

Writing Opportunities

We will write a Stone Age diary and create a fact sheet on Cave painting. When we look at the Iron Age, we will write stories and biographies about their heroes, kings and queens. We will write a persuasive pamphlet that would help sell a Celtic house.

Maths Opportunities

We will read maps using grid references. Through topic we will explore co-ordinates to find buried Celtic treasure and graphs to help organise our findings.

Social, Moral, Spiritual, Cultural

We will learn about the Iron Age gods and goddesses and the customs people practised, especially when we look at Stonehenge.
