



As Historians we will learn about the history of crime and punishment in Britain. We will look in detail at the different justice systems through the ages and gain a better understanding of the different crimes that were committed and the resulting punishments that followed. This will include: The Roman Legacy, Anglo Saxon Laws and Justice, The Torturing Tudors, Victorian Prisons and the story of The Highway Man. At the end of topic, children will evaluate and compare modern day crime prevention and detection methods with those from the past.

As artists we will be looking at the art form of block printing. The creation focus will be on our Science topic: 'Living Things and Their Habitats' where we are going to base our designs on nature or animals.

Speaking and Listening

We will work towards researching and presenting our findings about Crime and Punishment in Britain in the form of a reflection and evaluation activities.

We will take part in a debate about Crime and Punishment through the ages, making comparisons with modern crime and punishment methods.

Writing Opportunities

During Literacy sessions, we will be focussing on our sentence structure. We are going to look at the work of Alan Peat to help us structure our sentences.

We will be reading and retelling the story of the Highway Man to find out if he was a villain or hero.

Year 5 will produce a non-chronological report on the crime and punishment throughout the ages.

Maths Opportunities

During Numeracy sessions will be consolidating and extending our work with the four number operations.

We are going to be focussing on data handling, Roman numerals and measures.

Social, Moral, Spiritual, Cultural

We will learn about how fair the different justice systems were and what affect this had on the people at the time.

We will explore our feelings when we read the stories about how some people were treated through the ages when it comes to crime punishment.
