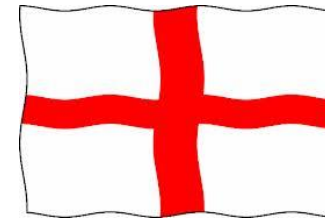


National Curriculum

We will learn about the Physical Geography of the UK and create detailed maps using correct geographical words. We will use a key in our map work. We will research how people and the weather can change an environment.

As historians we will learn about the lives of famous British people who have had an impact on society e.g. Winston Churchill, Alexander Bell, Bob Geldof and Dylan Thomas. We will create a timeline of important British events.

As artists we will create a collage of British symbols using various media.

We will write an information leaflet about the Wirral.

We will recount a famous story connected with one of the countries in the British Isles.

Maths Opportunities

We will be reading maps using grid references and producing our own maps of Wirral.

We will measure temperature and rainfall.

We will produce graphs to represent our data.
