As geographers we will ask and answer questions about places. We will learn whereabouts the UK is in relation to other countries in the world. We will learn about the Physical Geography of the UK and recreate detailed maps using correct geographical words. We will use a key in our map work. We will research how people and the weather can change an environment.

As historians we will learn about the lives of famous British people who have had an impact on society. We will create a timeline of important British events.

As artists we will sketch famous Liverpool and London Landmarks.

Speaking and Listening

We will ask and answer questions about different places in the UK.

We will listen to other people's views about a place.

We will talk in detail to an audience about a place we have studied. We will recount the life of a famous British person.

We will give a weather report for the British Isles which we will turn into a podcast using our ICT skills.

Writing Opportunities

We will be writing persuasive leaflets, posters and adverts to encourage people to visit our local area.

We will write an information leaflet about the Wirral.

We will recount a famous story connected with one of the countries in the British Isles.

Maths Opportunities

We will be reading maps using grid references and producing our own maps of the local area.

We will measure temperature and rainfall. We will also produce graphs to represent our data.

We will be introducing more reasoning and exploration into our maths curriculum.

We will explore the diverse cultures within Britain.

We will further develop a sense of pride in our nation.

We will open P4C enquiries about important issues and questions that are raised through this topic.
