A reminder that the 10th of the month is 'Bug Busting Day' when we encourage parents and carers to check their child's hair


If you have any concerns about persistent head lice please speak to Mrs Hardy, our Home School Liaison Officer

Attendance

Whole school attendance of 96.2% remains just below our whole school target of 97% but has improved since last month. Please see the graph below to see how well your child's class is doing to meet our target. Congratulations to 6J who have the best attendance so far this year and to 1W, 2M, 2E, 3R, 4O, 5S, 6D, 6J and 6P who have improved their attendance since last month.

We have been working hard all year to reduce the number of pupils who are in the Persistent Absence category, which means that they have below 90% attendance. This would mean that so far this year they have missed at least 14 days of school. There are currently far less pupils in school who fall into this category, see the tables below for numbers in each year group.
