



A craft activity for you to try!
As we are fast approaching sunnier weather some of you might try flying kites. Can you make a kite to shine in the sun on your window?



You will need:

Black paper strips
Coloured squares
Glue/sticky tape
String

Make the main outside shape and create an inside frame from black strips. Glue or tape this together. Now using the coloured squares, fill the gaps so that the whole kite is filled with colour.

Using the string, add a tail to the kite and decorate with bows if you wish!

How about trying a little baking? This Rocky Road needs no cooking:



Ingredients:

100g chocolate
100g plain biscuits
70g butter
100g marshmallows
(chopped or mini)

Method:

1. Grease and line a baking tin.
2. Place the biscuits in a bag and break them into pieces no bigger than a 50p piece.
3. In a saucepan melt the chocolate and butter until it is smooth, then remove from heat.
4. Add the biscuits, marshmallows and any raisins/cranberries to the chocolate mix.
5. Tip it into the baking tin and cool in the fridge for 2 hours.

You will need:

Kitchen roll
A dish of water
Water-based felt tip pens

Method:

1. Cut a rainbow shape from kitchen roll.
2. Use the felt tip pens to colour a 2cm rainbow at both ends.
3. Dip the ends of the rainbow into the dish of water.
4. Watch!
