

We are really enjoying marking your work and reading your blogs. Here is something different for you to try so you are not spending too much time looking at a screen.

Maths:

Hi, my name is Mr Shape and my body is made from different shapes.

Can you find different objects in your house that are different shapes, make a shape person and label the shapes? You could use a cylinder tube for the legs or a sphere for the head.



Literacy:

We want you to imagine you are going on a holiday. Are you going to a hot country or a cold country? What will you need to pack in your suitcase? Can you write a list of everything you would pack if you were going on holiday and then describe the place you are going to. Don't forget if you are leaving the United Kingdom you will need a passport.



Science:


When out on your daily exercise see if you can spot a flower on the ground. Try and find one that has already fallen to the ground. Your challenge is to **dissect** it. Once you have done that you need to label the different parts.

Dissect means take it apart.



Phonics:

Create your own phonics mat at home. First of all draw a picture of anything you like. Make sure there is lots of detail on your picture. Then add labels to the mat to help learn new digraphs and CVC words.



Yoga Alphabet:

At home see if you can try these yoga poses in a safe place. We would recommend having a go on a mat.

Art and Crafts:

Now that summer is approaching, the days are getting warmer. Have a go at drawing or painting a tree that shows all four seasons. We did something similar to this in Autumn when we were in school.
