Make some music

In the story Jack took a harp. What is it? Can you use the internet to help you find some music played by a harp? How do you play it? Does it make a loud or soft sound?



Can you make your own instrument? You will need yoghurt pots, paper, tape, rice, lentils or stones to shake inside. How will you play it? Remember to stick the top tightly to the pot!_Can you make some loud music?

Can you play softly/quietly?



Can you make up a song about Jack climbing up the beanstalk and sing it to your family?



Build a 3DGiant's Castle

Can you build a castle for a giant using boxes and containers that you have at home. These are solid shapes and we call them '3D shapes'. Could you try to use cubes, cuboids, cylinders, cones – a grown up can help you to learn their names.



Be a Superstar Word builder

Can you see how many cvc words (with three letters) that you can make from the following letters?

m d g o c k i n a t p s

Make a list of the words and post them on Tapestry.

Giant Strides

Giants take big steps called 'strides'. Can you walk like a giant and see how many strides it takes to walk to your kitchen? How many strides to walk across the living room and your bedroom? Who has the longest stride – you or your grown up? When you're out exercising, play a game and guess how many strides it takes to get to different places. Did you guess correctly?
