We have a halving challenge for you to try at home. Have a go at these questions. Then see if you can make three of your own halving questions.

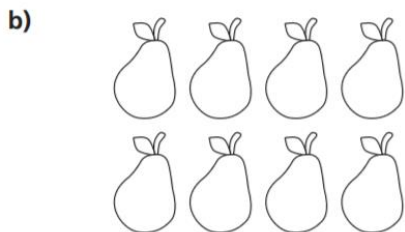
- 1 a) Circle half of the pencils.
