


F1 Home Learning - Week Beginning 11.1.2012



Hello F1 we hope you are all doing well at home with your grown-ups. We are missing you in school. This week we are learning about the story Goldilocks and The Three Bears. Here are some activities to do at home.

LITERACY

Please read the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears. If you do not have a copy at home, you can find different versions on You Tube. Please talk together about the story. Who are the characters in the story? What happened at the beginning, in the middle and at the end of the story? What was your favourite part?

Can the children draw a picture of the three bears and Goldilocks? Can they write their name on their picture?



MATHEMATICS

Can your children find 3 teddy bears, 3 bowls, 3 spoons and 3 chairs. Carefully count each object and say the numbers 1,2,3 together.

Can your children find a small teddy bear, a middle sized teddy bear and a big teddy bear. Can they put them into size order and talk about them using the words big, bigger, small and smaller than.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Please have a look on You Tube for the song 'When Goldilocks Went to the House of The Bears'. Have fun singing the song and joining in with the actions.

Can your children create a picture of their favourite teddy bear using paint or felt tips or crayons or collage materials?



UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

We would love you and your children to make some porridge for breakfast. Explore together the textures and changes when adding warm milk to the porridge oats. Do you and your children like the taste?



PSED

Children, please talk to your grown-ups about the character Goldilocks. Do you think she made a good choices or bad choices? Grown-ups, please talk to your children about safety and the importance of staying close together when going out for a walk.
