


F1 Learning from Home Activities - Week Beginning 22.2.21

Communication and Language

Can you think of some describing words to describe the characters from the story? Can you put the describing words into sentences, e.g.

Little Red Riding Hood is kind because she baked a cake for Grandma.

The Wolf is mean and scary because he wants to eat Little Red Riding Hood.

Physical Development.

Can you sing the song 'Heads, shoulders, knees and toes' and do all the actions? How fast can you do all the actions?

Play together with your grown ups the counting and chasing game 'What's the time Mr Wolf?'

Little Red Riding Hood was very kind to her Grandma. Can you do something kind for your Grandparents this week? Maybe phone or facetime and sing them a song? Or draw or paint a picture for them or maybe help make a cake for them?

Numeracy

Can you find a basket, some apples and a dice at home?

If it lands on 6, please put 6 apples into the basket, and so on.



Understanding the World

Can you help make a cake for your Grandma or Nana? Can you mix the ingredients together? When your cake is baked in the oven, can you talk about the changes that have happened?

Talk to your grown up about our senses. What do we use our eyes, ears and noses for?

You could go on a sensory walk around Mersey Park. What can you see? Close your eyes, what can you hear? What can you smell?



Expressive Arts and Design

Can you make a feely picture for your Grandparents? Find leaves, twigs, glitter, sand, textured materials and make a colourful, feely, collage picture.
