Curriculum Coverage

The whole school continues to follow our own 'Mersey Park Music Scheme' using the scheme builder from Charanga. It includes key sections in the scheme such as links to year group topics, PSHE, Jigsaw or diversity themes. In each half term they have a 'Significant Person' shared read to explore links within the songs and the style indicator they are learning about. Each lesson has music, progressing through each year. Every lesson starts with a vocabulary quiz to complete which links to all the music lesson they have learnt within the year.

Areha Franklin was born on March 28, 1942, in Memphis, Tennessee, Her mothet was a gospel singer, and her father was a nationally known minister at the New Bethel Baptist Church in Detroit Michigan, Franklin sang in the church's choir and was recognized as a vocal prodigy (an unusually talented child).

In 1987 Franklin was the first woman to be inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Pame. Over the course of her career she won 18 Grammy Awards, including a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award. She also received a Kennedy Contert Honor in 1904, a National Medal of Art in 1909, and the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2005. Al Barack Obama's 2009 presidential inauguration Franklin sang "My Country Tis of Theee" for a crowd of more than 1 million. Franklin ided in Detro on August 18, 2018. Latest that year the documentary Amazing Grace, which chronicle of the 1972 album, premiered.

We are continuing the use of 'Knowledge Organisers' for Music. We have both KS1 and KS2 knowledge organisers for the different genres of music covered in the Music Curriculum. Each one includes key vocabulary, skills, learning objectives and key terminology. The children will study these at the start of a unit of work and refer to it throughout the lessons.
