Writing

In our literacy lessons we will be learning about the adventures of Katie Morag and write descriptions of Struay, the island she lives on, as well as some of the characters we meet on Struay. We will write character descriptions of some of the characters in the stories. We will research lots of minibeasts to find the most interesting facts. We will continue to work on writing in full sentences and writing question and exclamation sentences.

Reading and Spelling

In our reading we will be continuing to sound out longer trickier words and trying to read most familiar words fluently. We will be learning these sounds in spellings and looking out for them in our reading books: er – e double consonant - ing, ed /or/ - a before I, II /u/ - o We will also be looking for these tricky words; last, past, father, grass, pass, class, plant, path, bath, hour We will continue to apply our comprehension skills by answering questions about the books we have read.



Maths

In our maths lessons we will be continuing to look at multiplication and division. We will use bar models to help us work out tricky word problems. We will learn more about fractions of shapes and amounts. We will learn how to find half, guarter, three quarters and a third of a numbers and shapes. We will learn how to tell the time to o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to and we will start to try to tell the time to 5 minute intervals.



Foundation Subjects

Our topic this half term will continue with 'Island Adventures'. As geographers we will learn the location of the 5 oceans and the 7 continents. We will learn about the geographical features of an island, including both human and physical features. We will make comparisons of a non- European island and a UK island. We will compare the weather, landscape, jobs and cultures. We will look at cold and hot areas of the world. port, harbour, island, vegetation



Science

In science we will be learning all about 'Living Things and their Habitats'. We will explore and compare what the terms; living, dead and never lived mean. We will discuss how living things have offspring which resemble their parents and they themselves grow into adults which reproduce. We will order the stages of growth of humans from birth to old age. We will be reintroduced to the term 'habitat' from Year 1 and discuss a new term 'microhabitat' and talk about the difference between these terms.
