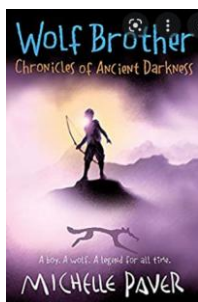

Year 5

Writing

In our literacy lessons, we will be reading Wolf Brother. We will be using this as the stimulus for a diary entry and a non-chronological report.

We will also be studying the classical poem Daffodils by William Wordsworth.



Reading and Spelling

We will be learning these spelling patterns each week and we will be looking out for them in our reading books; Homophones or near homophones.

We will also be looking for these common exception words; achieve, apparent, bargain, bruise, community, mischievous, muscle, necessary, vehicle, system.



Maths

In our maths lessons, we will be learning about decimals.

We will read, write, order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places.

We will also solve problems involving numbers with up to three decimal places.

We will learn to recognise and use thousandths and relate them to tenths, hundredths and decimal equivalent.

We will also extend our knowledge of properties of shape.

Foundation Subjects

Our topic this half term will be 'Travels around the Americas'.

We will use maps to find out about North and South America, including their states and countries.

We will locate physical and human features of North and South America.

We will then compare features of Yucatan and the Wirral peninsula.

In PE we will be learning how to play cricket and improving our striking and fielding skills. In Art we will be improving and developing our drawing skills and applying chiaroscuro to create a Banksy inspired piece.

Science

In science we will be learning all about 'Animals including Humans'. We will learn that plants and animals have life cycles and that reproduction is a part of this cycle.

We will recognise that each life cycle has distinct stages but that these can vary between species, for example we will describe and contrast the stages of the human life cycle with three and four stage metamorphosis in insects and amphibians.
