What is phonics?

- Sounds/phonemes represented by letters/graphemes
- A phoneme can be represented by one or more letters. (sh, th, ng, ee)
- Correct enunciation Pronunciation phrase

- Daily phonics session Monday-Thursday Revision - Friday
- Oral blending/segmentation
- Blending letters to read
- Letter formation Using correct formation phrase
- Tricky words

Reading Practice Sessions

- Initially picture books to encourage development of book handling skills. Big focus on the development of vocabulary through discussion about the pictures.
- All books with words are fully decodable through use of phonics and tricky words which have been taught in phonics sessions.
- 3 sessions each week in a small group with a teacher, reading the same book with a different focus during each session.



Reading at home

- Phonics keyring including grapheme, pronunciation phrase and letter formation phrase. Keyrings will also include tricky words as they are taught – updated weekly.
- Fully decodable reading book which has been shared during the Reading Practice sessions will be sent home in your child's book bag on a Friday. This will need to be returned by Thursday the following week.
- Non decodable book for sharing These books should be read to your child or shared with them and play an essential role in developing a love of reading.
