Religion and World Views - July 2025

- How do some people talk to God?
- Where do our morals come from?'
- Why is it better to be there in person?


Within each unit a range of religions and world views are studied. These include Abrahamic religions, Dharmic religions and Humanist worldviews.


Key Stage Two has found the implementation of the new scheme to be challenging, but in a good way! The children have been challenged to broaden their



understanding of religions and worldviews and begin to develop their own thoughts and ideas. The teaching also shows explicitly that the religions studied have more in common with each other, than they do have differences.

Key Stage One has found the implementation more difficult and next year we will further adapt the curriculum to ensure it is more accessible and meets the needs of our younger children.





As a school community, we have been able to celebrate Christmas and Easter at two of our local places of worship – Tranmere Methodist Church and St Catherines. Our younger children have also been able to visit St Catherines and have participated in a variety of workshops.

Charlotte, from St Catherine's Church, has continued to visit school. She holds regular assemblies for the children in Key Stage one and Two/ She also runs a weekly Bible Club for pupils across Key Stage Two.
